power that I began to see challenges through a spiritual lens.



ver the years, I've learned wisdom can come from blessed experiences or through the trials from which God delivers us. Last year, I was diagnosed with Myelodysplastic Syndrome (MDS), and I want to share my journey to healing with you.

MDS is a disorder affecting the blood cells and is known as preleukemia. Blood diseases like anemia, lymphoma, and sickle cell impact millions worldwide.

As I started my search for a donor, I began to face a formidable reality of how difficult the search would be. Due to a glaring lack of diversity in the donor pool, African Americans have a significantly harder time finding a match. For example, there are 8 million people in the blood donor database, yet only 6% of those are people of color.

While stem cells cure many blood diseases, a sick person needs a donor with the same ethnic background and similar genetics. As a result, only 30% of African Americans are healed from blood diseases compared to roughly 80% of white Americans. This is why education is critical if we are going to win the fight to be well.

When the doctors diagnosed me, I was grateful to be surrounded by family, prayer warriors, and Bishop and Mrs. Serita Jakes. Bishop gave me a word, saying, "You're not done. God has much for you to do still." That helped me stay strong in faith as I continued the fight for my life.

The Lord has provided, as my youngest daughter's bone marrow DNA is a perfect match for my stem cell transfusion. Though she was a premie at birth, she has become God's instrument to save my life.

After three months of the initial treatment in preparation for my stem cell donation, my condition miraculously stabilized, putting me into remission. I may have found my donor, but this fight is far from over. There are many people, just like me, who are still in dire need, and I am determined to spread the word and encourage everyone to register to become a donor to save a life.

To that end, our team has worked tirelessly to create the *Distinctively Debutantes* program to pour wisdom into the next generation of forward-thinking women through mentoring and life coaching.

Since 1997, girls between the ages of 10 and 17 have been edified based on the foundational pillars of faith, etiquette, chastity, finances, and human relationships to build on a rich legacy of community and fostering the growth and readiness of women.

We believe in the reach-and-teach approach, so each year, for seven months, trained mentors work closely with the debutantes. All enrollees must maintain a B or higher academic standing, have a membership at a local church, and demonstrate outstanding character, leadership, dependability, and service in school and/or the community. Their training culmi-

nates with a formal graduation and royal cotillion.

Since the program's inception, nearly 1,000 girls have graduated and gone on to become educators, doctors, CEOs, lawyers, and more.


